


Planning Our Vision

Following the same model as we dreamed, planned and executed in 2015 at our first ever Native National Partnership Retreat, called **WALKING IN OUR MOCCASINS**, the retreat will begin with two days of strategic planning with Tribal leaders, consultants, and community partners working through a process to prioritize 6-8 projects that focus on the Tribe's greatest needs. On the third day of the retreat, federal, state, and private funding partners will be invited to join the Tribe as partners to refine the solutions and identify potential resources to implement the following projects:
